Manly is a great area to ride in with a long and proud history of cycling. Pedal power is good for your wellbeing, your wallet and the world!

Stay safe, wear your helmet and follow our top tips for a fine ride:

- Be Bright and use your lights at night.
- It is the law – wear a bike helmet.
- Use your bell. Ring early, ring loud!
- Making eye contact with drivers helps them know you're there.
- People, children and dogs are unpredictable – slow down and give way.
- Watch out for car doors – ride a metre around them.
- Use cycleways, quiet streets or shared paths. Be aware of signs.
- Lock your bike – 'D' locks are the most effective.

We especially need to remind all cyclists that they must wear a properly fitted helmet when riding a bike on both the road and the pathways. It is a law in Australia and the police can fine you if you do not wear one!
