## CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Hi Clontarf Residents,
I hope you have all been able to enjoy the festive season and the Clontarf Precinct sends you and your families Bes Wishes for 2014.
We finished 2013 with a great Xmas Party night at Clonnys, which was enjoyed by all. It was great to meet lots of new faces from the community and hear your perspectives on community issues. We hope we can encourage you to come to more of our meetings during the year.
We have been asked by Council to send in our proposed projects for 2014. These were discussed at our meeting in December last year.
The 3 priorities we have suggested to Council are:

1) Continued upgrade to Clontarf Reserve including returfing, new seats and picnic tables in the area under the trees near the children's playground. We have also asked Council for their thoughts on maintaining a good surface under the trees where traffic is heavy.
2) Fix the holes and broken steps on the track between Sandy Bay and the Spit between the new works at either end.
3) Add a new seat with back support adjacent to the storm water outlet near the roundabout in Sandy Bay road. This was suggested by a resident with some mobility issues so that there is a midway resting point when walking around Sandy Bay.
If you have any suggestions we would still appreciate hearing from you.
Last year Council and Mike Baird announced th intention to construct a public wharf on Clontarf beach in line with the end of Holmes Avenue. We have discussed this at prior meetings and had mixed views. Council would like us to advise them on community attitudes to this proposal so if you have a view please come to our next meeting so we can fully brief Council.
You may recall we requested last year that the footpath in Amiens Road be resurfaced and that was underway toward the end of last year and is now completed
The diversion of the Clontarf pool storm water drain away from the pool has also been completed with the digging of a number of large absorption pits which are designed to stop the flow of storm water directly into the pool. We will assess the effectiveness of this with the next large down pour.

A number of Precincts are moving ahead on the opportunity to create community gardens in their areas If you would like to find out more we will discuss the Council requirements at our meeting next Wednesday.
The Combined Precincts continue to push for greate accuracy and transparency in the financial modeling for the Manly 2015 Plan. KPMG have reworked the financials and have reduced forecast profitability to close to break even for the car park under Manly Oval and there are still questions about the number of spaces needed. We have made our case to Mike Baird, our local member and Treasurer, and we are negotiating to organize a meeting with the Minister for Local Government.
Our next Clontarf Precinct meeting is this Wednesday 5th February, 7.45pm at Balgowlah RSL
I look forward to catching up with you then.
